Have you been Teflon coated? Teflon coating on pots and pans was a great discovery. The crud just wiped right out. How wonderful. I am not sure, but it seems to me that those are no longer considered safe. However, it is claimed

that there are other pans today that are just as effective.

When I was baptized into Christ, my sins were washed away (Acts 22:16). Before that time, there was no way for me to be cleansed of my sin. Now I have been Teflon coated (so to speak) through the blood of Christ. I cannot live in sin (1 John 1:7), but if, due to weakness or ignorance, I sin (1 John 1:8), I can repent (Acts 8:22) and acknowledge my sin to God and others I sin against (1 John 1:9; James 5:16), and that sin won’t stick. It, too, is washed away by the blood of Christ (1 John 1:7).
