Dear Brethren,

Greetings in the name of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ and from my family, We thank you for your continually putting us and the work of Cameroon in your prayers. We are also putting you all in our prayers so that your work is profitable for the Kingdom of our Lord, and pray that all goes well for you all.

All our programs of work are going on successfully. My children are all doing fine. Bibiche has just defended her Master's Degree, pending graduation from the University of Buea. Adeline had her Bachelor's Degree and is now working in the government General Hospital in Bamenda, waiting to be integrated into government service. Melchisedek went back for a one-year degree program in Bamenda, Theophilus has finished his primary level in the program in London. Eunice will also graduate this year with her Bachelor's from the University of Buea. Mirabel is now in Maryland; she will be going to the School of Nursing. My last daughter, Janet, will be writing the competitive G.C.E. "Ordinary"-level examinations this year in Cameroon Christian Academy. Thank you all for your prayers and I request your continued prayers for them.

Brother Paul and Sister Janet are doing fine in health. We had a nice time and were glad to receive our "son" Ryan and his wife, Laura, here in April 2010. The Kees saw them again when they had five weeks leave in the U.S., just after we all attended the National Annual Lectureship that was in Bertoua in November. Our vehicle left Nso at 5:00 a.m., November 24th and arrived at Bertoua at 12:30 a.m. on 25th November! Both public and personal evangelism were done in two languages over three days. There were about 40 congregations represented and we had 5 baptisms.

last Summer the Advanced Courses went fine, as all 4 students did well. The regular Bible School started on September 5th and is going on fine. We had 12 students in the Anglophone section. Four had to leave for poor grades. We had 3 in the Francophone section; one was let go for poor grades and one returned home because of family problems. I, Brother Paul and Brother Zacharia do the teaching in the English section, while Brother Jean-Pierre and Brother Mbinkar Emmanuel teach in the French section. We are now in the second quarter second term. We request prayers for the 10 present students, especially those who have been sick and even hospitalized.

The Moral Education classes in the High School are going well. The Catholic priests tried to stop us from continuing. They brought a schedule for moral education given by the Delegate of education. This was compiled by moral education instructors from different denominations. But we insisted that all teachings must be supported by Scriptures. I even warned that any teacher caught teaching their creed must be called to order. It was now difficult for them to carry out their evil decisions. They were telling students privately not to come to us, calling us a "sect." But to our surprise, we now have more than 250 students attending my class. Most of them are standing, not having enough benches on which to sit. We had 100% last year in Religion exams in that school.

We have started two radio programs in our two local radio stations. I preach every Sunday for one hour, while the other station carries 30 minutes on Saturdays, with other speakers rotating. We hope that nothing will stop these programs, because many are interested and asking us questions. The Bible Lesson Office is doing fine. We have more than enough material on our

shelved to give out, plus all that we use at our preaching places during the dry season.

We have been very busy this year with Public Bible Lectures. The plan this dry season is a bit different. Three of us evangelists each had three quarters (parts of villages) in which to preach. Brother Paul, because of his journey to the States, had two places where he went twice a week each, for four afternoons a week. Unfortunately, one of the most receptive was a Moslem quarter and persecution forced them not to continue, even though the majority of people wanted them to preach and no one gave back Bibles! Brother Oliver and Simon kept the other place going during December.

I have preached about 15 lessons in my best preaching place, Mah. In two of my places, our attendance was so poor or non-existent that we had to abandon public lectures and try house-to-house evangelism. Please pray for our prospects in Mbo'nso where we preached last year. There were two congregations started there. Old Camp, where Jean-Pierre preached (and we stayed in the same house when we went) had six converts, one of whom has died. New Camp, where Paul works (and Zacharia made use of the same house when he went) has had one restoration and five baptisms. The two congregations are doing fine, and Old Camp just officially opened their new building, with 74 attending Sunday. Please continue to pray for them and what we will have some more baptisms.

Cameroon Christian Academy is going on well. The four students all passed their G.C.E. "O"-levels with good grades. Two students who came in at Form Five (12th grade) did not pass. We are now completely involved in all school activities like marching and games. Pray for us to grow.

Sunday Visits are also going on fine, worshiping with different congregations each week. We will be going to Bamenda this week for a North West Quarterly lectureship/evangelization with the Sonac Street Church of Christ. The students and many others from Bui Division will go with us.
